

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
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
#### Dear GSA,

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
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Our future GSA has a learning experience rooted in studio

- There needs to be a sophisticated approach to integrating international students.

- Engagement is ongoing, not one-off.
- The collective intelligence of the community should be highly valued.
- Engagement needs to be followed up with action.

- The institution should support students and staff to develop their understanding of contemporary social and environmental practitioners.
- Graduates should be compassionate, engaged and critical.

- GSA should use its independence to push boundaries and demonstrate new approaches in higher education.
- Measuring success goes beyond financial KPIs, and looks at student experience, wellbeing, and social and environmental impact.
- The institutions size should support the community's priorities.
